LNU Holds 2025-2026 Commendation Ceremony for Outstanding Students and Groups



On May 13, 2026, Liaoning University (LNU)' s 2025-2026 Commendation Ceremony for Outstanding Students and Groups, themed "Youth Models, Striving for the Future" , was held at the auditorium of the Chongshan Campus. Pan Yishan, Secretary of the University Party Committee, attended and delivered a speech. Yu Miaojie, Deputy Secretary of the University Party Committee and President, addressed the ceremony. Zhang Hongxin, Deputy Secretary of the University Party Committee, presided over the event. University leaders Huo Chunhui, Wang Peng, Qiu Huangang and Lu Hui were also present.

In his speech, Pan Yishan, on behalf of the University Party Committee, extended congratulations to the honored students and collectives, high respect to the hardworking faculty and staff, and sincere gratitude to parents for their support to the university. He pointed out that holding the commendation ceremony on the 10th anniversary of General Secretary Xi Jinping' s important speech at the symposium on philosophy and social sciences work is not only a recognition of advanced role models in the past year, but also a practical implementation of the spirit of General Secretary Xi Jinping' s important speech.

Pan Yishan put forward five expectations for young students, encouraging them to be a decent person, study diligently, work earnestly, explore bravely, and keep fit. Students must stick to their bottom line as the fundamental principle of life, care for others to show warmth, and bear the responsibility for the country to demonstrate vision; bottom line, warmth and vision constitute the essence of being a decent person. Secondly, "don't just play with mobile phones, but master real skills." They should earnestly learn academic knowledge, turn class notes into knowledge maps, and develop solid capabilities to solve real-world problems; genuine competence is earned through diligence, tempering and perseverance, rather than coming out of nowhere, so they should become proficient experts through constant practice. Thirdly, "don't stay in dorms, go out and engage in practical things." They should step off campus to experience real situations, enter society to identify actual problems, and stand at the forefront to pursue practical innovation; classrooms should connect with fields, assignments should turn into solutions, they should write academic papers on the land and apply achievements to benefit rural families, achieving true excellence through trials and hardships. Fourthly, "dare to explore and experiment, and don't fear failure." As LNU students, they should carry the "eldest son spirit," dare to innovate and pioneer, and act as pioneers and vital forces; they should strive to solve problems when seeing them, tackle tough issues when encountering them,

gain experience from failures and change the world through striving. Fifthly, "health is the foundation of all endeavors, so don't overdraw your life." They should establish the philosophy of health first, form a habit of regular exercise, gain the ability to control their physical condition, stay bright-eyed, energetic and passionate about work, and march on the journey of life with strong physiques.

In his address, President Yu Miaojie sent messages to all LNU students. Chinese Mainland's First! Yu Miaojie Elected as Fellow of the Royal Economic Society and Awarded Postnominals FREcon

Recently, the Royal Economic Society (RES) sent a letter of congratulations to Professor Yu Miaojie, President of Liaoning University (LNU), informing him of his election as a Fellow of the Royal Economic Society (RES Fellow) and the conferment of the lifetime postnominals FREcon. This marks the first time the RES has awarded this prestigious distinction to an economist from the Chinese mainland. It signifies that the comprehensive influence of Chinese economists has gained high recognition from the mainstream international economics community and represents another major breakthrough for Chinese economists on the world stage. For a long time, LNU, leveraging its national Double First-Class discipline of Applied Economics, has been committed to advancing the construction of an independent knowledge system for Chinese economics. As the first scholar from the Chinese mainland to be selected as a founding Fellow, and now standing alongside several Nobel laureates, Professor Yu's achievement is a landmark event. It demonstrates that the theoretical innovations, empirical methods, policy insights, and disciplinary development experiences derived from China's economic practice have successfully integrated with global economic academic discourse and secured a rightful position in the international academic evaluation system. This represents a significant milestone for China's economics circle in its efforts to go global, participate in global academic governance, and enhance its international academic voice. It also

provides strong evidence for the construction of an economic discipline system with Chinese characteristics, style, and spirit.

The Royal Economic Society (RES) was founded in 1890 as the British Economic Association and was granted a Royal Charter in 1902, officially becoming the Royal Economic Society (RES). As one of the world's most venerable and influential economic associations, the Royal Economic Society (RES) has long been dedicated to advancing economic research, education, and public policy debate, earning a distinguished reputation across the global economics community. Throughout its history, the Society has numbered among its members and leaders some of the most eminent figures in the discipline. These include Lord John Maynard Keynes, a founding architect of modern macroeconomics; Alfred Marshall, a central figure in neoclassical economics; and Sir John Hicks, a Nobel Laureate in Economic Sciences. Each of these giants of economic thought played a pivotal role in shaping the academic framework of the Society.

The Society's flagship journal, *The Economic Journal*, founded in 1891, stands as one of the most important academic journals in modern economics. Its other publication, *The Econometrics Journal*, has also become a highly influential professional journal in the field of international econometrics. The title of Fellow of the Royal Economic Society (RES Fellow) is a significant academic honor conferred by the Society upon economists. It is

awarded through a rigorous selection process to distinguished scholars who have made outstanding contributions to the discipline in areas such as original research, teaching and mentoring, service to the profession, policy practice, and the dissemination of economic knowledge. Currently, there are only 127 RES Fellows worldwide, representing some of the most influential scholars in global economics. Among them are Nobel laureates including Daron Acemoglu, Simon Johnson, James A. Robinson, Philippe Aghion, Angus Deaton, and Oliver Hart, as well as internationally renowned economists such as Richard Blundell, Lord Nicholas Stern, and Silvana Tenreyro.

Professor Yu Miaojie's election as the first economist from the Chinese mainland to become a Fellow of the Royal Economic Society (RES Fellow) and to receive the lifetime postnominals FREcon fully demonstrates the Society's high recognition of his original research contributions, teaching excellence, service to the discipline, policy practice, and international influence. It further underscores his academic standing and professional reputation within the global economics community. Professor Yu Miaojie's main research fields are international trade and China's economic development. He has long been engaged in research areas such as firm heterogeneity, processing trade, global value chains, and trade policy, and has made outstanding contributions to promoting Chinese economic research into the mainstream research themes of international economics. To date, Professor Yu has published over 230 peer-reviewed papers in authoritative journals at home and abroad, among which more than 30 have appeared in top-tier and

first-class journals including *The Economic Journal*, *Review of Economics and Statistics*, *Journal of International Economics*, *Journal of Development Economics*, as well as *China's Economic Research Journal* and *Management World*. His papers have been cited more than 6,770 times in total, with an h-index of 33 and an i10-index of 72, demonstrating extensive international influence. Among these, his sole-authored representative paper *Processing Trade, Tariff Reductions, and Firm Productivity* was published in *The Economic Journal*, the flagship journal of the Royal Economic Society, and won the 2015 Royal Economic Society Prize. To date, this paper has been cited 1,281 times. The paper reveals the important impact of China's independent opening-up policy on improving firm productivity and accelerating the formation of China's new quality productive forces. It is also the only paper by a Chinese economist to have won this prize so far, and has been recognized as one of the three most influential papers on the Chinese economy published in *The Economic Journal* since its founding in 1891, fully reflecting the important value of China's economic experience for the development of international economic theory and innovation in empirical research.

In addition to high-level academic research, Professor Yu Miaojie has long been actively serving the international economics community, China's economic policy practice, and the training of high-level economics talents. In 2024, the Royal Economic Society invited Professor Yu Miaojie to serve as an Associate Editor of *The Economic Journal*, marking the first time the journal has invited an economist working in Asia to take up

this important position. Professor Yu also serves as Associate Editor of Review of International Economics, Editor-in-Chief of China Development Journal, Honorary Editor-in-Chief of Intertrade (a journal affiliated with the Ministry of Commerce), Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Liaoning University, Editor-in-Chief of Japan Studies, and Executive Editor-in-Chief of Journal of Chang'an University. In terms of talent cultivation, Professor Yu has personally supervised over 100 doctoral and master's students, and has long participated in the development of standards for university-level economics education in China. His Chinese textbook International Trade: Theory, Evidence and Policy has been recognized as a key national textbook under China's "14th Five-Year Plan". Recently, the edited volume China's Open Economy, of which he is the editor-in-chief, has become one of the nine China Series, a key textbook development project in original Chinese philosophy and social sciences in economics. At the same time, Professor Yu has been invited to the United Nations Headquarters to present reports on China's economic development, and has been appointed as an expert advisor to the United Nations, the Asian Development Bank, the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Commerce, and many local governments. He is also a deputy of China's National People's Congress. He has played an active role in international academic exchanges, policy consulting, and the positive narrative and dissemination of China's voice. This election as a Fellow of the Royal Economic Society (RES Fellow) is another major recognition for Professor Yu Miaojie from the international mainstream economics community, following

his invitation to serve as Associate Editor of the Economic Journal, the world's top economics journal under the Royal Economic Society, and his election as a Fellow of the International Economic Association (IEA Fellow). This honor is a strong affirmation by the Royal Economic Society of his long-term academic accumulation, original research contributions, international academic influence, and service to the discipline. It also fully demonstrates his outstanding achievements in the fields of international trade, China's economic development, and firm heterogeneity. Professor Yu Miaojie's election as a Fellow of the Royal Economic Society (RES Fellow) not only further confirms his academic standing and international influence, but also reflects the growing academic contributions and influence of Chinese economists in the international economics community. It is another landmark achievement of Liaoning University's "Double First-Class" construction and the internationalization of its economics discipline.

Rare Library Exclusive on Show, Savour the Timeless Charm of Ancient Classics

At the "Treasure Sharing" session of the Reading Festival, President Yu Miaojie unveiled the mystery of the crown jewel collection of Liaoning University Library and wholeheartedly recommended books to young students.

Zhang Ming: Liaoning boasts profound historical and cultural resources, yet many precious ancient books and documents remain little known to the public. Today, three experts and scholars will present Liaoning's cultural treasures. Let

us welcome our first guest for the "Treasure Showcase" — President Yu Miaojie of Liaoning University. Hello, President Yu! A warm welcome to you.

Yu Miaojie: Hello, host. Hello everyone. I'm Yu Miaojie.

Zhang Ming: President Yu is a familiar face at our National Reading Festival. Before presenting your treasure, could you briefly introduce Liaoning University and its prestigious library to us?

Yu Miaojie: Certainly. Liaoning University is the only provincial university listed in China's Double First-Class Initiative. Over its 78 years of development, the university has grown into a comprehensive institution covering a full range of disciplines including arts, history, philosophy, economics, management, law, science, engineering, medicine and art.

Founded in 1948, Liaoning University Library is a national and provincial key preservation unit of ancient books. With a total building area of 40,000 square meters, it serves as a vital platform for the collection, preservation and research of ancient documents. At present,

the library houses over 7,000 categories of ancient books, amounting to 140,000 volumes, making it an important literature resource base for the research of Qing Dynasty history and Manchu culture in the Liaoshen region.

Zhang Ming: With such a wealth of precious ancient books, which one would you recommend today, President Yu?

Yu Miaojie: Today, I am honored to recommend the crown treasure of Liaoning University Library — Essentials of Mukden Scenery and Relics, a unique extant copy rarely seen nationwide.

Elegantly bound, the book is handwritten in standard Palace Academy Calligraphy, with red ink punctuation and markings throughout. It bears the imperial seal Treasure Inspected by Emperor Qianlong, possessing extremely high historical and research value.

Completed in the early reign of Emperor Qianlong in the Qing Dynasty, the book was compiled and transcribed by Li Zongwan, a renowned literary official and painter-calligrapher of the imperial court. It was a personal companion reading for

Emperor Qianlong during his second eastern inspection tour.

Consisting of twelve volumes in total, it records the geographical layout, mountains and rivers, local products, historical figures and famous poems and essays of Mukden in the Qing Dynasty. More valuably, it fully includes 341 poems composed by Emperor Qianlong during his first eastern inspection tour.

This ancient book vividly reproduces the historical landscape of Northeast China in the Qing Dynasty, provides numerous rare historical materials, and fills gaps in the research of Qing imperial history and culture. The preservation and study of this classic also embodies Liaoning University's commitment to inheriting and safeguarding historical cultural heritage.

Zhang Ming: Thank you for your detailed introduction, President Yu. Appreciating the charm of ancient classics makes us better understand the significance of reading. Could you share Liaoning University's experience and practices in building a campus culture immersed in the fragrance of books?

Yu Miaojie: General Secretary encouraged us to love reading, read good books, and read proficiently. Liaoning University has thoroughly implemented this important spirit. We regularly hold a variety of reading activities on campus, among which the flagship initiative is the series event: Hundreds of Professors Recommend Masterpieces, Tens of Thousands of Students Read Good Books.

Yu Miaojie Delivers at NPC Meeting: Breaking Enterprises' Involution Competition and Accelerating the Formation of a Unified National Market

On April 29, 2026, Zhao Leji, Member of the Standing Committee of the Political Bureau of the CPC Central Committee and Chairman of the NPC Standing Committee, attended the meeting of the 22nd session of the 14th NPC Standing Committee. During the symposium with NPC deputies, including Ma Bing, Li Guangxia, Zheng Jie, Yu Miaojie, Zhao Jing, Qi Xiumin, Yuan Silang, and Li Shengpo. They delivered speeches and offered suggestions in light of their respective work, focusing on the implementation of the guiding principles of the Fourth Session of the 14th NPC.

The 15th Five-Year Plan period is a critical phase for consolidating the foundation and making comprehensive efforts to basically realize socialist modernization. The development environment is facing profound and complex changes, with strategic opportunities and risks and challenges coexisting. Accelerating the formation of a unified national market and promoting a new pattern of independent opening up are practical necessities based on national conditions and directly addressing challenges.

At present, the fundamental internal cause of enterprises' involution competition and relative overcapacity in some industries lies in "strong supply, weak demand". Insufficient market demand forces enterprises to cut prices, resulting in lower profits and declining worker incomes, which further leads to reduced consumer purchasing power and insufficient aggregate social demand. How to "raise incomes, strengthen demand, and break involution" has become a focus of attention. Meanwhile, trade protectionism adopted by some countries has led to weak external

demand. Therefore, the key to addressing "strong supply, weak demand" is to expand domestic demand, and the core of this is to accelerate the formation of a unified national market.

Regarding improving the business environment and activating internal drivers, it is recommended to increase precise investment in projects under the Two Major Areas and Two New Initiatives and to persist in expanding quality and capacity. In addition, unimpeded flow within the domestic large market hinges on eliminating local protectionism and reducing transaction costs. Efforts should continue to remove redundant toll stations on highways, lower toll fees, and improve logistics efficiency. Greater efforts should be made to enforce discipline, reduce implicit transaction costs, and create a clean business environment where "one can get things done without seeking favors and exercise power without seeking personal gain."

To address the vicious cycle of enterprises' "involution" competition, it is recommended to introduce supportive policies to encourage differentiated products within industries, preventing enterprises from engaging in homogeneous low-price competition. A mutual verification mechanism for the quality inspection of domestic and foreign trade products should be established and improved. Through strict supervision, enterprises are compelled to shift from price competition to quality competition. Benchmarking against advanced international standards, mechanisms should be explored to directly and quickly convert international standards that are higher than domestic standards into national standards.

China Open Macroeconomic Forum (COME) (11th Session) Successfully Held at LNU



On the morning of May 23, 2026, the 11th Session of the China Open Macroeconomic Forum (COME) was successfully held at the Puhe Campus of Liaoning University (LNU). The forum, themed “Rural Revitalization and Agricultural Modernization”, was convened to thoroughly implement the key tasks set out in the 2026 Central Document No. 1, which aims to anchor agricultural modernization and solidly advance comprehensive rural revitalization, as well as to systematically promote China’s agricultural powerhouse strategy. During the forum, participants engaged in in-depth discussions centered on theoretical innovation, future planning, and practical pathways for agricultural modernization, contributing to the advancement of comprehensive rural revitalization and the building of China’s agricultural power. The forum was chaired by Professor Qiu Huanguang, Member of the Standing Committee of the CPC LNU Committee and Vice President of the university.

In his address, Professor Yu Miaojie, President of LNU, pointed out that 2026 marks the first year of the 15th Five-Year Plan period and a crucial moment for fully embarking on the 2035 long-range goals, advancing the building of China into an agricultural powerhouse, and promoting

More than 80 participants, including principal leaders of the units under the Division of Economics as well as representatives of faculty and students, attended the forum.



Professor Huang Zhuo from Peking University Delivers the 27th Bai Qinxian Distinguished Lecture



On April 21, 2026, the 27th session of the Bai Qinxian Distinguished Lecture Series was successfully held at the building for the Faculty of Economics, Puhe Campus, Liaoning University. Professor Huang Zhuo, Professor of the National School of Development (NSD), Peking University, Fashu Scholar, Vice Dean of NSD, and Dean of NSD BiMBA Business School, was invited as a keynote speaker. Professor Yu Miaojie, President of Liaoning University, delivered an opening speech. The lecture was chaired by Professor Qiu Huanguang, Member of the Standing Committee of the CPC Committee and Vice President of Liaoning University.

In his speech, President Yu Miaojie warmly introduced and highly praised Professor Huang Zhuo. He pointed out that Professor Huang has long been engaged in cutting-edge research in financial econometrics, digital finance and AI economics, publishing many high-quality papers in top domestic and international journals, several

of which have been selected as ESI highly cited papers, and has won important awards including the Higher Education Outstanding Scientific Research Output Award from the Ministry of Education. Professor Huang has pioneered the three paths of AI-driven economic transformation and profoundly pointed out China's strategic advantages in application scenarios and a complete industrial system. As the principal investigator of major projects such as the National Natural Science Foundation of China, his research closely focuses on major national needs including digital finance and financial risk prevention, and his achievements have provided key academic support for relevant policy-making. Meanwhile, Professor Huang has made remarkable achievements in talent cultivation, winning the Peking University Teaching Excellence Award, and playing a key leading role in promoting the high-quality development of the Off-Campus Economics Minor Program of the National School of Development, Peking University. With solid theoretical innovation, forward-looking strategic vision and profound dedication to education, Professor Huang is acclaimed as an outstanding representative who stands at the academic frontier and serves national development.

After the lecture, President Yu Miaojie presented a commemorative certificate to Professor Huang Zhuo.

This lecture was organized by the Department for Social Science Research and the Faculty of Economics, and undertaken by the China Economic Research Institute. More than 80 faculty and student representatives from affiliated units of the Faculty of Economics attended and listened to the lecture.

Research Team from School of Physics Publishes Article in Advanced Functional Materials

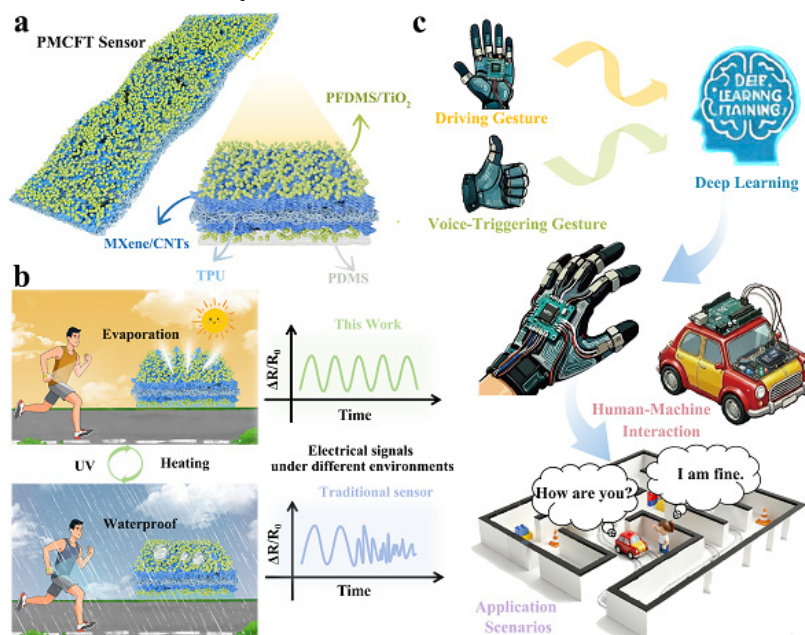
Recently, a research team led by Associate Professor Chu Zhenming from the School of Physics at Liaoning University (LNU) has achieved significant progress in the study of fabric-based flexible strain sensors. Their findings, titled “Multifunctional Janus-Structured Conductive Fabric with Environment-Adaptive Wettability Switching and Strain Sensing for Wearable Electronics” (DOI:10.1002/adfm.75680), have been published in the prestigious journal *Advanced Functional Materials*. With an Impact Factor of 19.0 for 2025, this journal is a top-tier publication in the fields of materials science and condensed matter physics. This work was supported by the National Natural Science Foundation of China, the Natural Science Foundation of Liaoning Province, and the Basic Scientific Research Project of the Educational Department of Liaoning Province.

Overview of the Paper

Skin-interfaced electronic devices based on impermeable substrates and stacked structures often suffer from poor sweat permeability and insufficient mechanical matching between layers, posing significant

obstacles to long-term wearing comfort and stability. To address these challenges, this study developed a multifunctional Janus-structured strain sensor based on thermoplastic polyurethane (TPU)/MXene-carbon nanotube composites using a simple swelling and in-situ adsorption process. The sensor features a hydrophobic inner layer and a tunable wetting outer layer, enabling directional liquid transport and dynamic environmental adaptability. It demonstrates excellent comprehensive sensing performance, with a strain detection range of 0–150%, a gauge factor (sensitivity coefficient) of 194.575, and remarkable stability over 8,000

consecutive testing cycles. Furthermore, the underlying sensing mechanism was elucidated by combining micro-level analysis with macro-structural evolution studies. Beyond accurately monitoring human motion signals, the sensor achieved a high-precision sign language recognition rate of 97.53% with the assistance of machine learning algorithms. Additionally, by integrating the sensor into a control glove, wireless operation of a mechanical vehicle was realized, demonstrating its potential applications in human-computer interaction.



LNU Shines in 3rd Liaoning Province University and College Students' Career Planning Competition

The 3rd Liaoning Province University and College Students' Career Planning Competition came to a successful conclusion a few days ago. Teachers and students of Liaoning University (LNU) achieved excellent results with solid career planning competence and outstanding on-site performance. Zhao Senhao from the Faculty of Information and Hu Wenhui from the School of Art won gold awards in the Course Teaching Track, setting the best record in the history of participation. In the final of the student track, all six contestants from Liaoning University entering the provincial final won gold awards, making a major breakthrough. In this provincial competition, our students won six gold awards, five bronze awards and five excellence awards in total, and six teachers were awarded Excellent Instructors. Liaoning University undertook the employment track with high standards, provided all-round event services and carefully organized the closing ceremony and award ceremony, and was awarded the Outstanding Contribution Award by the organizing committee of the competition.

During the preparation and competition, teachers and students of LNU practiced the concept of "integration of education, science and technology, and talents driven by real problems in social realistic scenarios", and took the competition as an important platform to test the effectiveness of education and temper professional literacy. Focusing on real problems such as public welfare charity fundraising specialist, Northeast Asia supply chain finance manager, non-litigation lawyer, ideological and political teacher in remote areas, technology-enabled product manager, and grassroots community police officer, they identified

their development positioning, integrated personal career ideals into the comprehensive revitalization of Liaoning, and demonstrated the responsibility of contemporary youth in integrating "small self" into "big self". The careful guidance and full empowerment of instructors are a vivid reflection of the effectiveness of employment education and career education in our university.

Hosted by the Department of Education of Liaoning Province and co-organized by Liaoning Province University and College Students' Employment and Entrepreneurship Center, this competition was undertaken by Liaoning University, Dalian Jiaotong University and Liaoning Jidian Polytechnic College. With the theme of Dream for Youth, Aim for the Future; Plan for the Voyage, Lead the Future with Career, the competition set up the Growth Track and Employment Track for college students and the Course Teaching Track for teachers, covering all academic stages of junior college, undergraduate and postgraduate students, attracting more than 850,000 students from 103 universities and colleges in the province to register.

Dream for youth and aim for the future; plan for the voyage and lead the future with career. Taking this competition as an opportunity, Liaoning University will continue to deepen promoting learning, teaching and employment through competitions, constantly improve the career education and employment guidance service system, guide the majority of young students to establish correct career views, employment views and job selection views, and contribute youthful strength to serving the national strategy and the comprehensive revitalization of Liaoning.
